His sense of humour, kindness and interest in all fields of knowledge were legendary. Between 1958 and 1965 he was in charge of the production of the Chelmsfordian Magazine and in 1967 he took charge of the Audio-Visual Department.

He served as Captain in the Royal Artillery in WW2 , much of the time being spent as O.C of the Signals Training centre in Kenya. It was there that he gained his lifelong love of languages, and when he returned to his studies at Exeter University he changed his course from Economics to Modern Languages. He donated some of his cherished library to KEGS.
